Motion A14 ( <i>Carried</i> ) In 2013, based upon the prediction that people can expect to spend up to a third of their life in retirement, legislation was introduced to raise the State Pension Age (SPA) from 66 to 67 in April 2026, and to 68 in 2044. However, the government has since asked its Actuary to remodel this prediction, to add more criteria, and to raise the SPA to 68 in 2037 rather than 2044. Before the next general election, conference instructs the Executive Council in collaboration with the NPC, to ask each political party to state the criteria and principles they would use in any future review of the SPA, and to give an undertaking that the SPA will not be raised beyond the age of 68. At the very least, if an exemption for vulnerable groups disadvantaged by age, disability or income cannot be provided, then payment in notes of coins, with change returned, must be retained if the cost of upgrading to the 4G network is not an option. Motion A24 (Carried) The CSPA Annual General Meeting (AGM) recognises that there has been continual failure of the Westminster and Devolved Governments in Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland to deliver fully costed and comprehensive Social Care Systems throughout the four countries of the United Kingdom. This has put an unfair and unreasonable burden on older people who have to pay disproportionately high fees, in many cases this has led to the sale of family homes to meet the costs incurred. This CSPA AGM calls on the Westminster Government and the three Devolved Administrations to finally resolve this outstanding issue which is of supreme importance to older people and their families. We want to see a National Social Care System, established with National Standards, but designed and developed within the Framework of the Devolved Nations of the UK. It notes with concern, however, that when surveyed by Unison in 2022, 89% of adult social care workers were worried about their ability to provide a good service, and 73% felt their workload to be excessive. The impact of continuing funding cuts to local authority services, even those statutorily required, plus increasing numbers of social workers leaving the profession, risks – for example – delays to care assessments of elderly people awaiting discharge from hospital, and reduced support for people to remain in their own homes. This AGM therefore instructs the EC to campaign, and to support campaigns by partner bodies, for increased government funding for social work, enabling vacancies to be filled and frontline workers adequately paid.
