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DATA SUBJECTS RIGHTS



DEFINITIONS

- Personal data – any information relating to an identified or identifiable person.
- Data subject – natural (living) person – think patient, visitor, employee and supplier.



THE SEVEN PRINCIPLES

1. Processing lawfully, fairly and in a transparent manner.
2. Collected for specified, explicit and legitimate purpose and not further processed in a manner that is incompatible with those purposes.
3. Adequate, relevant and limited to what is necessary in relation to the purposes for which they are processed.



THE SEVEN PRINCIPLES

4. Accurate, and where necessary, kept up to date.
5. Kept in a form which permits identification of data subjects for no longer than is necessary for the purposes for which the personal data are processed.
6. Processed in a manner that ensures appropriate security of the personal data, including protection against unauthorised or unlawful processing and against accidental loss, destruction or damage, using appropriate technical or organisational measures.



THE SEVEN PRINCIPLES

The controller shall be responsible for and be able to demonstrate compliance with the first 6 principles.

RIGHTS OF THE DATA SUBJECT



- Right of access.
- Right of rectification.
- Right of erasure (right to be forgotten).
- Right to object
- Right to restrict processing.
- Right to data portability.
- Right not to be subject to automatic decision making.

THE RIGHT OF ACCESS



- No Charge
- 1 month to respond
- Why processing data
- Who shared with
- Copies of the data

THE RIGHT OF RECTIFICATION



- Accuracy
- No Charge
- 1 month to respond
- A Qualified Right



THE RIGHT OF ERASURE

- The Right to be Forgotten
- No Charge
- 1 month to respond
- A Qualified Right
