#### A snapshot of caring in 2024



The value of carers' support in the UK is a staggering £162 billion per year

- Every year, 4.3 million people become unpaid carers – 12,000 people a day.<sup>6</sup>
- 59% of carers are women.7
- Women have a 50:50 chance of providing care by the time they are 46; men have the same chance by age 57 – 11 years later.8
- 3 in 5 carers are worried about living costs and how they will manage in future.<sup>9</sup>
- 27% of unpaid carers have bad or very bad mental health; 79% feel stressed or anxious, 50% feel depressed and/or lonely.<sup>10</sup>

- Nearly 3 million carers are juggling paid work and unpaid care across the UK – 9% of everyone in employment.<sup>11</sup>
- 51% of carers take over a year to recognise their caring role, with 36% taking over three years to do so meaning they often miss out on vital support when they need it most.<sup>12</sup>
- 61% of carers are uncertain about what practical support they can access.<sup>13</sup>
- 57% of carers say they do not have a life outside of caring and are unable to remain connected to the people who matter to them.<sup>14</sup>

#### Carers' priorities for the future

Through our State of Caring survey, 11,000 carers told us about the changes they would like to see in the future:

- 83%: Reform of Carer's Allowance and other social security payments.
- 80%: Investment in social care services.
- 80%: The introduction of two weeks of paid Carer's Leave a year for working carers.
- 73%: All carers to be supported to take a break.

- 72%: New NHS legislation to ensure carers are regularly identified and supported.
- 70%: Improvements to carers' health and wellbeing.
- 66%: Caring to be made the 10th protected characteristic under the Equality Act.
- 61%: Better identification and awareness of unpaid carers.

- 2. Stop cases of Carer's Allowance overpayments.
- 3. Invest in carers' breaks and respite services and legislate so all carers have a statutory right to a break in England.
- 4. Make the NHS the most carer-friendly health service in the world, with new rights and practical support.
- 5. Introduce a statutory right to paid Carer's Leave for working carers.
- **6.** Recognise caring as the 10th protected characteristic under the Equality Act 2010.
- 7. Provide sustainable funding and investment in social care services.
- 8. Support carers to better manage their health and wellbeing.


