- 1. Local Groups, and the volunteers who support them, are the lifeblood of CSPA and must remain central to the effective representation at local level, where members wish that to be the case. Without a viable local Group structure, it will become more difficult to attract new members and retain existing members. Currently up to 60% of members are not allocated to an open Group, which challenges the democratic basis of CSPA and the representative nature of the AGM. This democratic deficit must be addressed, with all options being explored by the Executive Committee as a matter of urgency, alongside the priority of recruiting new members to support the work of local Groups.
- 2. The role and purpose of the EC Regional Representative should be strengthened, without any immediate need for constitutional changes, building on the existing capacity and commitment of active local Group representatives, to establish a Regional Forum of local volunteers across the Region, chaired by the Regional Representative.

The purpose would be to

- find new ways to engage with members across the Region; and
- provide a Regional focus for CSPA's campaigning capacity;
- enhance CSPA's visibility across the Region;
- agree local initiatives to support local Groups, where requested.
- Utilise the avilable technology of video meetings on Zoom or Teams platforms to trial virtual Group meetings where appropriate;

New initiatives are being trialled in different Regions to engage with members in 'No Groups', and to seek to merge closing groups with open groups, or add unallocated post codes to open groups, where appropriate.

The O&R Committee is to continue to monitor progress. GC 957/24 issued to advice on protocols for groups threatened with closure.

EC (O & R Committee) to agree simplified protocols for merging and closing groups.

The Greater London, North West and South West Regional Reps have advertised/held trial 'Meet your Regional Rep' events for 'No Group' members in different centres – dates and other arrangements for these events are being promoted on the website, in The Pensioner (new Regional Reps' column) and by email.

Discussions with CSRF and Boundless on possible joint events in areas where there are no active groups across the organisations. Note - GS/DGS reports to the Campaign and O&R Committees in Sept 2024.

whilst recognising that different approaches will be needed in each Region taking account of local circumstances and geography.

These developments will need to be closely monitored by the Executive Council and the AGM, with any constitutional or budgetary changes being considered where a need is identified.

3. Simplify the governance framework within which local Groups operate to remove barriers to participation and encourage informality at meetings.

Simplify the process of merging closed Groups with open Groups, with a clear transparent protocol that is permissive so as to encourage local and Regional initiatives to improve the local structure of CSPA and encourage more members to get involved locally."
