

CSPA AGM 2025

The CSPA AGM 2025 report has now been completed and gives a full record of the decisions taken. The complete report can be viewed/downloaded at:

Among the motions passed was A17 seconded by Bournemouth, that for a trial period of 2 years, *“The posts of Chair, Vice Chair, and five ordinary members of the Executive Council shall be voted upon prior to an AGM in a ballot of members.”*

The reason for supporting this was that a majority of members do not belong to a group and are therefore disenfranchised. Even if there is a group, such as here in Bournemouth, it covers such a wide area that often members are unable to get to the meetings.

When it comes into being you will be sent details of the voting method and candidates' details.

CSPA Campaigns

Printed copies of the CSPA Group Circulars outlining current CSPA campaigns and news are always available at our meetings but if you cannot attend, they are also available on the website.

The CSPA website says *“Our campaigns change over time as we respond to the changing needs of pensioners and the pressures they face. We encourage members and groups to support these campaigns. This might mean signing a petition, or meeting or writing to your MP to secure their support.”*

If you feel strongly about any of the issues, this is a good way to highlight them. You can find out who your MP is on the UK Parliament website: <https://www.parliament.uk/>

If you don't have a computer, the Electoral Registration Officer at your local council will be able to identify your MP based on your full address. Public libraries often keep a physical copy of the Directory of MPs or can access the information for you, again using your address.

Current CSPA campaigns include those calling for:

TRANSPORT

Investment in local bus and rail services, improved accessibility and assistance for older people on all new bus and railway stock and facilities.

PENSIONS

All political parties to make manifesto commitments to guarantee the State Pension triple lock for at least the duration of the next Parliament.

HOUSING

All new homes to meet the Lifetime Homes standard with a national strategy for more adaptable, accessible homes across all tenures.

COMMISSIONER FOR OLDER PEOPLE

The UK Government to create an Older People and Ageing Commissioner for England and Scotland.

DIGITAL EXCLUSION

Government to combat digital technology's role in social exclusion and access to services.

HEALTH & SOCIAL CARE

A National Social Care Service integrated with the National Health Service that remains free at the point of delivery.
